Who are we?

Almost Home Dog Rescue of Ohio was established in 2003 to rescue Collies, Shelties and other family-friendly breeds and mixes. AHDRO is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and all donations are tax-deductible. We are all volunteer, and 100% of the donations we receive go directly to our rescue dogs.

Where do our dogs come from?

Our rescue dogs come from shelters where euthanasia is eminent, through breeder surrenders, from owners who can no longer care for their dogs, and from concerned citizens who report strays or abused dogs.

What do we do for our dogs?

Veterinarians provide the following:

Physical exam

Blood work

Vaccinations

Heartworm testing and treatment

Fecal exam for bacterial infection and worms

Spay or neuter

Dental

Grooming

Other medical care as needed

Why do we rescue?

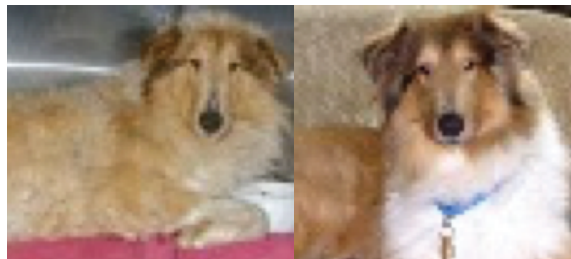
AHDRO is unique in that we do not discriminate due to age, health or condition of our rescue dogs.
